Notes on A.B. Cook and Fane Dickson Collections

It was in March 1948 that this catalogue was adumbrated, when Mr. Seaby, in his "A Dealer's Dream" in our Bulletin of that month, wrote "It has long been our hope to publish some day a Catalogue of Greek Coins but our stock has never been sufficiently representative to make it worth while." By a fortunate chance, the next month brought us the highly interesting collection formed by Professor Arthur Bernard Cook, Vice-President of Queens' College, Cambridge. Dr. Cook's collection had been brought together by many years' work and contained some unique and many extremely rare pieces; and although it was a student's collection, ie., more consideration had been given to the historical interest of the coins acquired art. With this collection, it yet contained some very notable examples of the moneyer's art. With this collection as a nucleus, and additions from such collections as the Fane-Dickson, the present work has been compiled.

This is the only man allowed to sign Metapontum's coinage and one of the outstandly rare cases in all of Magna Graecia where the artist's name is given in full. Only 10 specimens with this particular signed obverse die, Noe 503-505, were recorded by Noe. Thus they are rare. Our example is flatly struck on the hair which is the norm for this otherwise very beautiful type.

The reverse depicts the mythological story of Bellerophon, a guest of Proetus, King of Argos, who was wrongly accused by the Queen of making unsolicited advances. He was protected by the Furies, thus Proetus declined to kill him. Instead Bellerophon was sent to Iobates, King Lycia, father of the queen with instructions to remove him. Iobates, too refrained from murdering his royal guest. Instead he request that Bellerophon kill the Chimaera. After consulting a seer, Bellerophone captured the Pegasos whom he could use to great advantage by riding above the Chimaera. The point of action on our coin is Bellerophon spearing the Chimaera. Probably less than 6 of these coins exist of which ours could be the finest known. 7.16.

This was done towards the close of the Peloponnesian war in order to equip a completely new fleet. In 406 B.C., the situation had not improved and as the citizens could not use gold staters for daily transactions, Athens resorted to bronze tetradrachm with a silver wash as a money of necessity. These coins continued as legal money for 13 years until in 394, Conon won a great naval victory which restored Athens to prosperity. At this time silver was declared the only legal tender, thus demonetorizing the "frogs" as Aristophanes referred to them. Due to the great unpopularity of the "money of necessity" very few survived. A coin the state of ours, with $80 \%$ of the original silver wash intact, is excessively rare, for those which are genuine, most are entirely of bronze. Though some have a few flecks of silver, one with this amount of silver is almost unheard of. Most of the "money of necessity" offered today are fourrie; contemporary forgeries. The real "money of necessity" are only silver washed, not plated.
